COMPETITION RULES AND REGULATIONS

NAWIC DETROIT CHAPTER 183

MARGARET ELLIS SCHOLARSHIP ANONA WHITE SCHOLARSHIP

NOTE: DEADLINE JUNE 8, 2012

There will be three (3) scholarships awarded. Whenever possible, one award will be made in each of the eligible categories detailed below. If the scholarship committee deems one or more categories to be inadequately represented, multiple scholarships may be awarded in other categories.

ELIGIBILITY 1: Full-Time College Student (Open to Men and Women)

1. Applicant must be currently enrolled in construction-related field in an accredited program at an accredited university.
2. Student must have attained Sophomore status and have at least two terms remaining in a course of study leading to a degree or associated degree in a construction related field.
3. Student must be enrolled full-time.

ELIGIBILITY 2: Part-Time College Student (Open to Men and Women)

1. Applicant must be currently enrolled in an accredited program at an accredited university or in a community college program affiliated with an accredited university.
2. Student must have attained Sophomore status and have at least two terms remaining in a course of study leading to a degree or associate degree in a construction related field.
3. Applicant must desire a career in a construction-related field.
4. Student must be enrolled part-time and must be working to support said education in open market. (i.e., students living at home and funding said education purely through student loans and grants are NOT eligible for this scholarship.)

ELIGIBILITY 3: Apprenticeship Program (Open to Tradeswomen Only)

1. The student is enrolled in a full-time apprenticeship program leading to a journeyman's license in carpentry, electrical work, iron work, millwrighting, operating engineer, pipefitter or plumber.

REQUIREMENTS

1. Applicant is responsible for insuring that all items listed below are submitted to the Scholarship Committee and postmarked by June 8, 2012.
 - A. Completed and signed application.
 - B. Evaluation form completed by your academic advisor/employer.

- C. Official transcript of grades for 2 most recent quarter/semesters (Eligibility 1 and 2).
- D. Proof of employment for category Eligibility 2.
- E. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

AWARDS

1. Scholarships are not automatically renewed, but the student will be considered for subsequent awards if they provide evidence of continued need, continued interest in construction, and continued enrollment and good standing in a college program leading to a degree or an associate degree in a construction related field.
2. Applications will be reviewed and winners selected by the Scholarship Committee of the NAWIC Detroit Chapter, which will consider applicants' interest in construction, grades, extracurricular activities, employment experience, evaluations and financial need. All applicants will be notified of their status after the Scholarship Committee meeting in June 2012. The Scholarship Committee shall be comprised of one NAWIC Detroit Chapter member (the Scholarship Chair) and two industry representatives at-large. If a conflict of interest exists between the NAWIC Scholarship Chair and one or more of the scholarship applicants, an alternate member of the NAWIC Detroit Board of Directors will be named in the Scholarship Chair's stead. Such conflict of interests may include (but may not be limited to): applicant is a personal friend, student, or current or former co-worker of the Scholarship Chair. If a Detroit Chapter NAWIC member submits an application, the NAWIC Scholarship Chair shall designate a non-NAWIC industry member to the Scholarship Committee and will not be involved in the judging process.
3. All applicants selected as semi-finalists may be subject to a personal interview with a representative of the NAWIC, Detroit Chapter Scholarship Committee. The representative will be a member of the Scholarship Committee or the majority of the aforementioned members of the committee may appoint another person to conduct interviews. All semi-finalists will be notified of their status after the meeting of the awards committee in June 2012.
4. Checks will be awarded at the presentation ceremony to be held at an event to be selected by the Detroit Chapter Officers and Board of Directors.
5. Value of scholarships will be dependent upon the amount of funds raised by the scholarship committee. However, targeted scholarship amounts are \$1,000 for college scholarships (Eligibility 1 and Eligibility 2 criteria) and \$500 for the apprenticeship program (Eligibility 3).
6. As part of the acceptance of scholarships, scholarship recipients will be required to participate in at least one (1) NAWIC Detroit activity in the calendar year for which the scholarship has been awarded. The activity selected shall be the choice of the award recipient. Such events may include but may not be limited to Block Kids, **Mentoring A Girl In Construction (MAGIC) Camp**, December Holiday/Tin Can Raffle, WIC Week activity, September Officer Installation, or regular monthly meeting.
